Pre-Activation Clean-up



Sunday, Sept 29, 2024

Prior to the FEMA declaration Solid Waste and City Crews took action to assist families in need – Hurricane Helene Cleanup.

Pre-Activation Clean up began immediately and took place in a severely impacted area.

Clean-up Efforts Pre-Hurricane Milton

- On **Sunday October 6, 2024**, hundreds of City employees and resources were brought in to collect as much household debris as possible from Hurricane Helene before Hurricane Milton's arrival
- The collection efforts continued until **Wednesday October 9, 2024**. Hours before Hurricane Milton made landfall

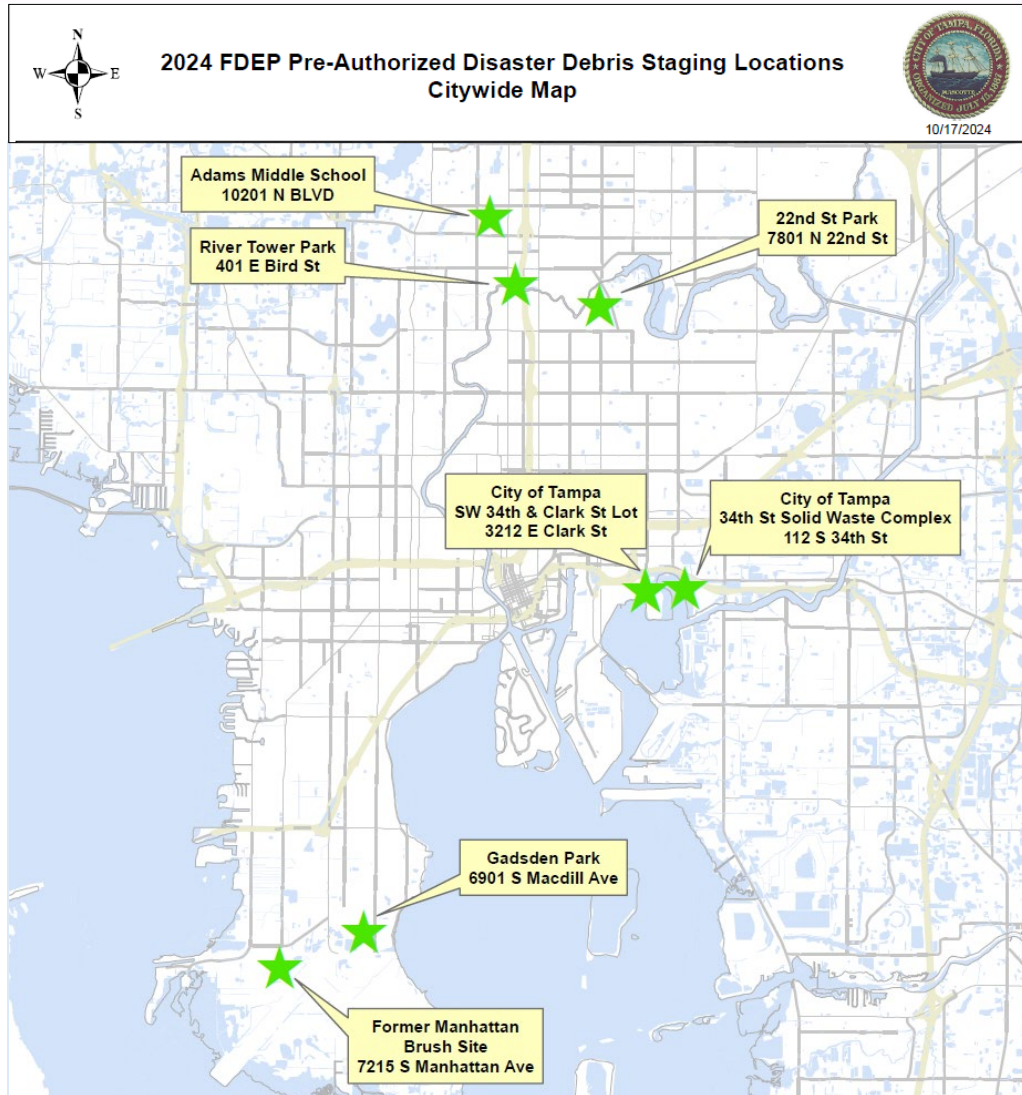

Storm Debris Disposal Options

Curbside Placement

Crews will collect damaged household items, construction debris, and vegetative-storm debris from the curb. Collecting **seven days a week from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. or Sunup to Sundown.**

Post-Disaster Pick Up
Separating Your Debris

Debris should be placed curbside without blocking the roadway or storm drains. **Separate into the categories shown below, with 3-ft clearance on all sides. Household hazardous waste, such as paint, car batteries, and electronics will not be accepted.**

Mixed Debris - Self Disposal

Self disposal at McKay Bay Disposal Complex at 112 34th Street. **Open M-F from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.**

- City of Tampa residents can dispose of all storm related debris for free of charge by presenting a government issued ID .

The name on the ID must match the name on the account, and waste must originate at the address stated on the account.

- Private Haulers will be assessed a fee.

Vegetative Debris – Self Disposal

Free citizen drop-off sites are established at the following locations to accept **vegetative storm debris only.**

Open M-SA from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

- 22nd Street Park at 7801 N. 22nd Street
- Gadsen Park at 6901 S MacDill Avenue

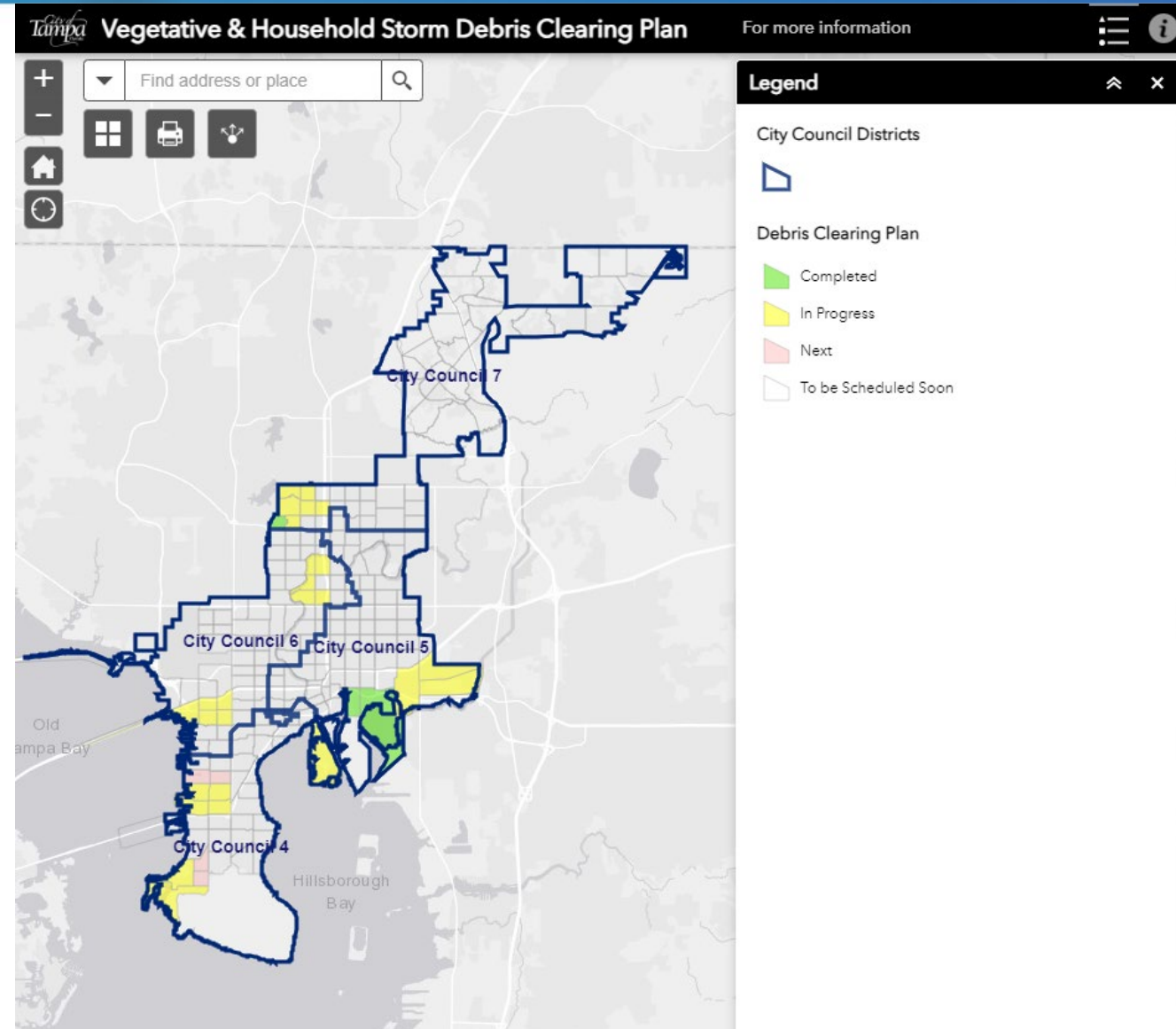



 STORM DEBRIS PICKUP STATUS- FIRST PASS

 In response to the damaging effects of Hurricane Helene, the **City of Tampa Solid Waste Department will begin collecting storm debris on Monday, September 30, 2024.** Storm debris collection will include vegetative debris, damaged household items, and construction debris. Yard Waste and SWEEP collection services are currently suspended and will resume upon the completion of post- storm debris collection efforts.

Residents ready for immediate collection may request service by calling the **Solid Waste Call Center at (813) 274-8811.** For those requiring additional time to assess and remove debris, the official collection will begin citywide on **Monday, October 7, 2024.** From that date forward, call-in requests will not be required as crews will canvass neighborhoods within the City of Tampa to collect debris from the curb.

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
