

DOBYVILLE

In the northwest section of the otherwise all-White Hyde Park neighborhood sat the Black enclave of Dobyville. Named for prominent resident Richard Doby, the Dobyville neighborhood started in the early 1900s and remained one of Tampa's primary, though smaller, African American neighborhoods. While many of the community's residents worked in the homes of some of Hyde Park's White residents, many others held a variety of jobs throughout the city. At its peak, the neighborhood had three churches, a school, and several small businesses.

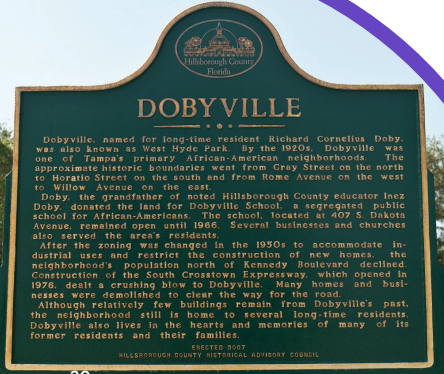
