

TAMPA HEIGHTS

Tampa Heights and Hyde Park are Tampa’s oldest residential suburbs, and both had segregated sections for African American residents. In Tampa Heights, there were actually two Black communities. One was just to the east of Central Avenue centered on Lamar Avenue; the other was west of Highland along Palm Avenue. It was common knowledge that Blacks could not live north of Kay street in either the east or west part of Tampa Heights.
