

THE GARRISON

The Garrison, as a neighborhood, grew from the closing of Fort Brooke by the War Department in 1883. Shortly after the closure, the property was transferred to the Department of the Interior and opened up for homesteads. Four families, three of whom were African American, filed for homesteads. Those three families eventually took possession of the eastern and northeastern sections of the old fort. The area was soon surrounded by the new Port of Tampa, and Black dock workers and their families began to move into the growing neighborhood.
