

WEST TAMPA & ROBERTS CITY

The Hillsborough River served as the official dividing line between the cities of Tampa and West Tampa from 1895 until 1925. West Tampa was founded by Hugh Macfarlane for the growing cigar industry. The cigar factories were filled mostly with Cuban and Afro Cuban workers. Though located on the west side of the river, Roberts City (bounded on the east by North Boulevard) was within Tampa's city limits. It was also home, in the early 20th century, to a Black Bahamian community in addition to Latin cigarworkers. Later, the city built the Clara Frye Hospital (segregated for Black patients) on the riverfront. The original Howard W. Blake High School, now Stewart Middle Magnet, and today's Blake High School are also in the neighborhood.
