

YBOR CITY

Tampa's main Latin neighborhood, Ybor City, was a cigar making center and is now a National Landmark Historic District. Part of the cultural makeup of Ybor was the Afro Cuban community. Located on the western end of Ybor, near The Scrub, the Afro Cuban neighborhood was home to cigar workers and others who worked in associated industries. The Marti-Maceo Club, for Afro Cubans, was torn down during Urban Renewal. The Pedroso Home, now Marti Park, was also razed during the 1960s.
