WHEREAS, J. Sterling Morton was a Nebraska newspaper editor who served as Secretary of Agriculture under President Grover Cleveland, and he proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

WHEREAS, known as Arbor Day, the holiday was first observed on April 10, 1872 with the planting of an estimated one million trees in the state of Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world, and celebrated annually in the state of Florida on the third Friday in January; and

WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, provide fruit and nuts, and beautify our community, and wherever they are planted, trees are a source of joy, artistic beauty, and spiritual renewal; and

WHEREAS, the Arbor Day Foundation, whose mission is to inspire people to plant, nurture, and celebrate trees, created its Tree City USA program in 1979 with the goal of greening communities across the nation, and for the past 36 years, the City of Tampa has received the Tree City USA designation.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Bob Buckhorn, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the city of Tampa, Florida, do hereby proclaim Friday, January 19, 2018 as

in the city of Tampa, Florida, and urge all citizens to join me in supporting efforts to protect our trees and woodland, and to support our city's urban forestry programs.
