WHEREAS, Myeloma or Multiple Myeloma, is an incurable rare blood cancer of the bone marrow and the second most common blood cancer that currently affects more than 100,000 people in the United States of America, with an estimated 20,000 new cases diagnosed each year and approximately 10,000 individuals will die from the disease; and

WHEREAS, Myeloma is also called Multiple Myeloma because the cancer can occur in more than one location and it is uncontrolled growth of plasma cells in the bone marrow, and the disease can lead to anemia, infections, bone lesions, vertebral compressions, osteoporosis, severe pain, and kidney dysfunction; and

WHEREAS, because Myeloma is a rare disease, often diagnosis is delayed, therefore postponing vital treatments that include chemotherapy, radiation, stem cell transplantation and other therapies, and if it is detected early patients can lead long and productive lives; and

WHEREAS, currently there is no cure for Myeloma patients, although some important advances have been made, and continued awareness, investment and innovation is critical to achieve early life extending diagnosis and treatments, and hopefully an eventual cure; and

WHEREAS, founded in 1989, the International Myeloma Foundation is an advocacy organization that serves the Myeloma community globally by focusing its efforts on education, research, support, and awareness and its Statement of Principles include *Prevention, Innovation, Access, and Early Approvals of New Treatments;* and

WHEREAS, the good health and well-being of the residents of the Tampa, Florida community are enhanced by increased awareness about Multiple Myeloma, and locally, the **Tampa–St. Petersburg Multiple Myeloma Education Group**, established in 2008, supports those patients and their families in our area currently battling the disease, and is committed to bringing about awareness, education, and a cure.
