WHEREAS, orange has been selected as the National Gun Violence Awareness official color, chosen by Hadiya Pendleton's classmates to commemorate her life, and it is a bold color that hunters wear to announce themselves to other hunters, and it symbolizes the value of human life; and

WHEREAS, to bring awareness to the Tampa Bay area about gun violence, the Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America, survivors, families, community leaders and partners with a vision of ending the epidemic of gun violence are hosting #WearOrange on Saturday, June 2, 2018 at The Portico in downtown Tampa, and the organizers are encouraging attendees to wear the color *Orange* in support of this initiative; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bob Buckhorn, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the city of Tampa, Florida, do hereby proclaim Friday, June 1, 2018 as

"NATIONAL GUN VIOLENCE AWARENESS DAY"

in the city of Tampa, Florida, and urge all residents to join in this important awareness campaign by wearing the color orange on Friday, June 1, 2018, and assist in creating a community free from violence of all forms.
